



CYBER SECURITY PROGRAM FOR NEW OLIM

A Cutting-Edge Opportunity
for Computer and Electronics Engineers Immigrating to Israel
*Offered by The Jewish Agency, the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration,
and the Rad-Bynet Group*

About the Program

This program of around 10 months is an opportunity to improve your Hebrew and adjust to Israeli culture in a supportive setting — with employment placement upon successful completion of a training course

Program Timeline

First 5 months: Intensive Hebrew classes (“ulpan”) at the Kiryat Yam Absorption Center.

Next 5-6 months: Professional training course in Cyber Security at the Technion.

After the program: You will be offered employment with a company in the RAD-Bynet Group, a leader in communications technology, or in other companies with referrals by RAD-Bynet.

Starting Date

The program begins on February 1, 2018 and lasts approximately 10 months. Those opting to move into the Sapir Absorption Center (see next page) may arrive starting January 18, 2017. (Note: arrivals to Sapir must be Sunday-Thursday.)

Eligibility

- ⊙ No age limit
- ⊙ Technical English and reasonable conversational English – required
- ⊙ You must meet at least ONE of these criteria:
 - Have academic or professional background in computer or software engineering
 - Work as an electronics or computer communication engineer with programming experience
 - Be either a new college grad (having studied computer or software engineering) or finished university earlier and have experience in the requested fields
- ⊙ 2-3 years' experience in software development – advantage
- ⊙ Experience in QA – advantage

Note: This program is not suitable for network managers, computer technicians, or those in computer systems.

Accommodations

Participants may either find their own housing in or near Haifa and the Krayot, or reside in the Sapir Absorption Center in Kiryat Yam.

Kiryat Yam is a small town, a 20-minute drive from Haifa. Sapir is located on the beach promenade. Within walking distance are schools, kindergartens, day care centers, health services, a post office, a shopping center, and city hall.

Common areas at Sapir, with free Wi-Fi, include classrooms, a youth club room, and a library. There is a yard and playground, soccer/basketball court, and area with outside seating.

The apartments are simply but comfortably furnished. Gas, water, and electricity are included in the rental prices; internet service can be arranged independently.

Residence at Sapir includes cultural activities such as holiday celebrations and trips around Israel, employment guidance, help with immigration logistics, and more.

Cost

This program is subsidized; a small fee to be determined will be announced before you register for the course.

For those living in the Sapir center, the additional monthly rent (which includes electricity, gas, and water) is as follows:

- ⊙ 2 singles sharing an apartment, each in his or her own room: NIS 1,150 per person
- ⊙ Family in a one-bedroom apartment: NIS 1,400
- ⊙ Family in a two-bedroom apartment: NIS 1,600

Deposit: Each family/individual must pay a deposit of NIS 500, to be refunded upon program completion if no damage has been caused to Jewish Agency property due to negligence.
